<p>PLOCK HUB</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The public meeting brought our attention to the fact that soft play areas are not income generating on its own. We should look at alternatives that require minimum maintenance. We should also think of other users of the building and how they can be impacted by the noise cause by children playing. Roger Cottis has started to work on the otter survey. He pointed out that some of the work by our Plock volunteers have likely disturbed otters and we should be more careful. Dualchas Architects were the Trust's prefer team to provide designs for the Plock Hub building and infrastructure. They are still working to obtain a quote for the Traffic Impact Assessment. Dualchas will set up a meeting between KLCT, MOWI and the Lynch Family for us to understand their development plans in Kyleakin. The consultation about the bollard has been finalised. We've had only 8 responses out of 72, 6 in favour of closing the entrance and 2 against. There was also 1 more form handed into the post office after the deadline. 	<p><u>Do you want to take into consideration the late response? Yes/No</u></p>
<p>WILDLIFE HIDE</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The teacher cancelled the school visit due to sickness. It needs to be rescheduled. 	
<p>LOCHALSH CONSULTATION</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> At the last Collaboration's meeting we've discussed the design and timeline. Several people also offered to help with things like helping with creating the Survey Monkey survey, leaflet or thinking of how to approach people through art. The Scottish Government opened an Investing in Communities Fund which we are working to apply to. The deadline is on the 14th June though! I've requested that HIE, on behalf of the Community Planning Partnership, sends us a statement of in principle support for our work in this project, which they did. 	
<p>ACTIVITIES</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Highland Green Health Partnership is keen to have Kyle as one of its pilot areas for testing social prescribing of green health projects. We will have a discussion with them and the Kyle Surgery about what it would involve. This pilot would be fantastic for our plans at the Plock and applications for the Ranger and a Community Engagement Officer. 	
<p>AGM</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The 'Cheese & Wine' AGM was attended by 22 people of which 17 were voting members. We also had 16 proxy votes. All Special Resolutions were approved as well as the Annual Accounts. Marc and Brian stepped down and since we had no new trustees joining the Board, there are now only 5 trustees.
